Slalom Racing

Class rep will assist with managing Slalom Ladder in conjunction with Club

Heat Assignment & Advancement

- Heat draw undertaken on Slalom Ladder prior to racing and briefed.
- Heats of “n” boards (typically 8-10); first 4 or “n/2” proceeding to the next round
- Single or double elimination
- Final with 8 sailors. 3 heats no drops. Combined lowest score wins

Heat Management

Time required for full double elimination based on male 80 competitors, plus separate womens = ~4-5 hours



Slalom

General

High spectator appeal - try to set course as close to shore as possible.

Start Sequence

- Upcoming heat posted on Start boat
- 1 minute start sequence
- Heat number removed
- Next heat not to start until all boards finished and placings recorded/confirmed onto Ladder



Lap 1 = P, Lap 2 = M

Course Length Guidance

Very short! The focus is on board handling. Target time 5-7 minutes

Leg length ~0.04 – 0.08nm

Start Line Length

Short = 3 board lengths = ~14 metres

Finish Line Length

Super Short = 1.5 board lengths = ~6 metres
