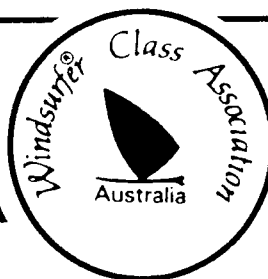

1990/91 WINDSURFER WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS - ADELAIDE

The organisers of the Adelaide World's did a magnificent job in the 9 short months they had to convert the Nationals into a World Championship that had everything, good wind, close racing and a great social calendar.

The event got underway with the weigh-in while the AYF Youth Nationals was being held and of course there was the usual conjecture about what the limits would be, who had drunk water and so on, there were a few surprises, Adam Quinn was a heavy, Tony Philp a light-heavy and Robbie Gough went down to the Light-weights.

The social events started with a welcome evening in the Henley Sailing Club. A comedian, Sir Les, a local chap, came on with a crude, lewd and extremely amusing performance that had many of the Australians thinking twice about the meaning and which completely baffled the internationals especially the Japanese contingent. Anyway it was a great way to break up the tense atmosphere as sailors prepared for the races to get underway the next day.

The marathon was a gruelling affair taking 3 1/2 hours for the leaders and up to 5 hours for the back of the fleet. The course went up and down the Adelaide coast from Henley to Grange and Glenelg with a few zig zags to throw in some reaching in the cross-shore winds which were blowing from 10-15 knots with a 1-2 metre swell.

The line was leeward end biased and Greg Hyde won the favoured pin end start and headed on the long leg along the beach to keep out of the current as much as possible, but it didn't pay off as the wind unexpectedly freshened and lifted on starboard tack putting Hyde back into around 5th. Peter Wright, Brendon Todd and Rob Howard led the huge fleet around the first mark.

From there on it was a war of attrition with the placings only changing by a few either way on each leg, heading into the last few zig zags before the final short leg to the finish line on the beach. Robert Howard had a 20 metre break on Greg Hyde with Peter Wright a similar distance back in third place. Rob mistook the finishing line for long enough for Greg Hyde to slip past to retain the World Marathon Championship that he won last year.

In the ladies 15 year old Natasha Sturges got away to a great start and went the right way on the first leg to set up an easy win and her first senior World Championship followed by American Lanee Butler and Melanie Murray.

'M' Course Slalom preliminaries were held the next day in winds ranging from 5 to 12 knots. On day 2 of the preliminaries the wind kept dropping, the tide was getting stronger then the wind and the thermometer was rapidly rising. It reached 41 Degrees Celsius that day which obviously melted the brains of a few competitors who decided to paddle around the slalom course and thought that this would be acceptable to the jury.

They claimed that as the rules said 'any means of propulsion could be used' that they were within the rules, however, this position was unacceptable on the starting line and in port/starboard situations, to the jury, and so their winning 'paddles' were disqualified.

New Years Eve, what a great night! The carpark was fenced and converted into a large open-ai red disco complete with dance floor and with the bands perched on the back of a semi-trailer, there was plenty of food and drink to give all the ingredients for a great evening to come.

Windsurfing Glenelg got the ball rolling with a fashion parade of the latest summer gear with a number of great looking ladies getting the boys itching to get on the parade floor. This is what happened at the conclusion, the girls dragged up a few guys and then everyone joined in and stayed right until the end of the night.

The bands were excellent with a mixture of rock and roll and R+B and one of the highlights of the evening was when a few girls were invited on stage during one suggestive song to add a few of their own suggestions, it sent the crowd wild.

New Year's day's events were attended by only about half the competitors, the rest were avoiding the second day of 41 degree temperatures and the glare of the sun, but those who took part had a good day.

It started with a dash for cash around Westlakes with \$500 prize money for the first man and women, Ken Moylan a veteran of the Westlakes geography took the right turn to put in a popular win and Melanie Braund led the girls home.

Next up was the freestyle preliminaries held in 4-6 knots and flat water, Dave Tonkin, Jean-marc Schwartz and Tony Philp were stand-outs in the men, but the girls division was far more even.

Sharon Richardson who initially thought that she had missed the final due to a number of falls qualified after the judges viewed a video tape which showed that a timing error had been made and that the falls were outside the time limit.

Sharon went on to place third in the final behind Melanie Braund who put in a strong routine of rail rides, spins and pirouettes and Japan's Kyoko Takaoka with a polished routine of railrides and splits.

The men's final had the top 3 qualifiers way out in front in the 8-12 knot winds which allowed the competitors to do more varied routines than in the preliminaries. Tony Philp with a very different routine of railrides and some new tail sink spins placed a close third behind Dave Tonkin who concentrated on sail manouvers and variations on sommersault's through the booms.

The winner Jean-Marc Schwartz from France a freestyle specialist just had the edge on the others through a varied and polished routine topped off by a board specially painted in tricolours.

The scheduled first days of course racing was a wipeout with no wind and 43 degree heat, but on day 2, a haze on the horizon which had ripples on the water in front of it rapidly made it's way from the ocean and grew as it approached the coastline to a mass of whitecaps.

This brought with it 25-30 knot winds and a refreshing drop in the temperature of about 20 degrees as the competitors readied themselves for the competition.



The combination of wind and waves ended many sailors hopes right from the start with half of each fleet failing to finish and in the women's only 3 did so, Sharon Richardson, Melanie Braund and Melanie Murray just inside the time limit, it was a great effort from them all.

As the series went on most of the races were held in 12 knots and above with those racing at the end of the second day getting another 25 knotter due to a rain squall, only on the last day did the wind lighten out to below 8 knots.

The lightweights started out as a six way battle between Tom Lenthall, Robert Gough, Peter Wright, Derek Couper, Robert Howard and Clayton McDonald. But as each race unfolded Tom and Goughie edged their way ahead with Goughie having to win the last race and Tom to finish 3rd or worse to win the title, but Robert Howard's all the way win in the lighter conditions put paid to his chances to lose by only 1.3 points.

Tom had been by far the most consistent sailor and deserved his victory, Goughie probably lost his way after a PMS in race 4, until then he was leading.

The Medium Weight division was expected to be won by 3 time World Champion Greg Hyde but this was not to be, Hyde despite winning most starts had no answer to Brendon Todd's straight line speed in the fresh conditions.

Brendon won six straight races, he broke his skeg on the way to the last race which was fortunate that it was not an earlier race, Hyde won this last race to edge out Dave Tonkin for second place.

The Lightheavies also saw an upset with 2 time World Champion Stuart Gilbert blown away by Tony Philp who also won the first 6 races straight with blinding speed, Stuart won the last race to edge out the top master Bruce Hodgins for second place.

The Heavyweights was incredibly a tie between Adam Quinn and Warren Williams after each had identical score cards, three firsts, two seconds and a third. Going into the last race Adam had to win to take the title with Warren only having to place second or 1 place behind Adam to win. At the first mark Adam was leading with wazza way back in 8th after a first beat which had wild wind direction and velocity changes. Wazza hit every shift on the second beat to get back to second place and then consolidated from there. Special mention should be made of Ken Williamson's effort in race 3 when he hit the opposite corner on the last beat to the leaders and crossed the fleet from way back to win on the line.

After the first heat in which only 3 finished and Sharon Richardson won easily all expected the womens to be a cake walk as long as the wind stated up. It stayed up for 5 races of which Sharon won 4 but Melanie Murray was hanging in there all the way.

When the wind lightened for race 6 Melanie's win and Sharon's sixth opened up the title, Sharon needed to place fourth or better to take the Championship otherwise Melanie could win it with another first place.

The pressure must have gotten to them both as they recorded their worst



results for the series giving Sharon the title, Melanie Braund was good for third place.

With the triangles over it was back to the slalom finals, this was held in increasing 6-12 knot winds and sloppy seas.

The Women's was won convincingly by Melanie Murray despite finishing last in the second race after a fall, she won the other 2 races to win narrowly from Sharon Richardson and Melanie Braund.

The men's was dominated by Brendan Todd who won 2 of the final races to beat Greg Hyde, a strong performance was put in by heavyweight Adam Quinn to place third and Tony Philp lost his winning chance with a PMS in the second race.

The overall titles were won by sailors who had only mediocre starts to the series in the marathon, Sharon was 4th but won overall with a first in the Course Racing, second in the Slalom and Third in the Freestyle, to edge out Melanie Murray with Melanie Braund in third.

Tony Philp had a fifth in the marathon but won with a third in freestyle, first in Course Racing and first in his division in the Slalom. Greg Hyde placed second.

The World's came to a close in fitting style with a trophy presentation and party that went on to 3am the next morning.
